Generous gift in memory of Carol Baumhauer

Almost a year after Carol Baumhauer's untimely death from the complications of a bone marrow transplant for leukemia, A. Joseph Baumhauer announced that he would take the first step of honoring his wife's life's passion - creating a better world for women and girls. Joe chose the Bucks County Women's Advocacy Coalition (BCWAC) to be the recipient of monies specifically to fund, on an annual basis, e-Tapestry software which allows rapid, targeted communication to specific audiences. According to Nancy Morrill, Board President BCWAC, "The support would give a tremendous boost to our efforts each year, growing our ability to connect, reach out, and communicate with Bucks County and Pennsylvania women, their families, and their allies. We are grateful for this generous gift in memory of Carol."

Carol was passionate about women's rights. She committed countless hours and resources to equality. Instead of complaining about discrimination, she worked tirelessly to change things. Carol was active in many community affairs groups and organizations including the Soroptomist International of Bucks County, a volunteer organization working to improve the lives of women and girls and, thanks to Carol, an early Partner organization of the BCWAC.

Joe Baumhauer said, "I believe that supporting The Bucks County Women's Advocacy Coalition by funding e-Tapestry will be a perfect first step to honor Carol's life of service. Carol was committed to the Coalition's mission and stayed up with what was happening even when she could not personally participate. What could be better than to continue on a path that she chose?"
