Bucks County Women's Advocacy Coalition applauds Governor Tom Wolf's decision to scrap HealthyPA and transition to the expansion of traditional Medicaid for low-income families. We have been advocating for PA to fully expand traditional Medicaid since the SCOTUS decision that made it optional under the ACA. We agree with Gov. Wolf that his decision is a step "toward simplifying a complicated process and ensuring that hundreds of thousands of Pennsylvanians have greater access to the health insurance they need." Under Gov. Corbett's HealthyPA plan families are enrolled in a complicated multi-tiered private plan resulting in confusion and delays or denials of essential medical services.

We are proud to see PA join the more than 20 states and D.C. in opting for expansion of traditional Medicaid. Gov. Wolf's decision will simplify unnecessary bureaucratic expense and confusion and extend health insurance to hundreds of thousands of low-income families, most of them working adults.
